WHEREAS the Listuguj First Nation created a Law "Governing the Production, Distribution, Sale, Possession and Use of Cannabis". However, due to Quebec's intransigence in facilitating the implementation of product acquisition for the Listuguj Mi'gmaq Government (LMG).

WHEREAS there is a desire to forestall this while allowing legitimate entrepreneurs to enter this field

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that pending the creation of a Cannabis Control Office and the attendant regulations, rules and policies) temporary vendor licences will be available on the following conditions:

- 1) The licences are temporary (valid for a maximum of 84 days) but can be renewed.  
It is understood that once the creation of the Cannabis Control Office (CCO) is completed, the temporary licences will be allowed to naturally expire and any renewals must follow the process and format established by the CCO
- 2) The licence holder must agree with and abide by the conditions stipulated within the Listuguj Law "Governing the Production, Distribution, Sale, Possession and Use of Cannabis" (save and effect any exceptions arising due to this Order-in-Council, specifically, the age of majority)
- 3) The licence holder must abide by all other applicable Listuguj laws and, if there is a conflict, the Listuguj Law "Governing the Production, Distribution, Sale, Possession and Use of Cannabis" shall be paramount
- 4) The LMG reserves the right to inspect all product, licences, certificates, or other documents held by the Licencee
- 5) The licensee agrees to report the following information with LMG:  
-product sales amounts on a quarterly (12 weeks) basis
- 6) The licensee agrees to pay to the LMG a \$300 a week fee
- 7) The licensee agrees, for the duration of the temporary vendor licence, NOT to sell product to individuals under the age of 21

- 8) The licensee agrees that the Temporary Cannabis Licence is NOT transferable nor can it be assigned to anyone other than myself nor used to sell product from any location other than from the address listed above.
- 9) The licensee agrees that the selling or distribution of illegal drugs shall result in the immediate revocation of the Temporary Licence and will jeopardize any future applications

The process for applying for a Temporary Licence will include the following:

- the potential licensee must submit a written proposal addressed to the LMG Cannabis Control Committee, outlining how they expect to meet the above conditions
- the potential licences will be required to sign a declaration indicating agreement with the above conditions
- the potential licensee will be required to submit advance payment for the initial 12 weeks

The approval will be based on the successful submission of the proposal, signing of the declaration and payment of the required fee (the Cannabis Control Committee shall be the sole judge in determining whether the three criteria have successfully been met). Where possible, such approval or rejection shall occur within 14 days of submission to the front reception of the LMG Administration Building (addressed to the Cannabis Control Committee). Approval will be in writing, with a copy sent to the LPD and the Chief and Council's Office
