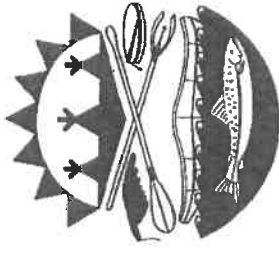


Listuguj Mi'gmaq Government Order-In-Council

WHEREAS the Listuguj Mi'gmaq First Nation is a Mi'gmaq community indigenous to Gespe'gewa'gi with a sacred, inherent responsibility for the stewardship of the land, waters, and living things of Gespe'gewa'gi;

WHEREAS the Mi'gmaq of Gespe'gewa'gi, including the Listuguj Mi'gmaq First Nation, have inherent, aboriginal, and treaty rights with respect to fisheries;

WHEREAS in R. v. Marshall the Supreme Court of Canada affirmed that the Peace and Friendship Treaties of 1760-61 and the Canadian constitution guarantee the Listuguj Mi'gmaq First Nation's right as a Mi'gmaq community to fish commercially in pursuit of a moderate livelihood;

WHEREAS, in order to govern the conduct of our lobster fishery, on June 17, 2019, the Listuguj Mi'gmaq Government Chief and Council adopted the Listuguj Lobster Law, which requires to the Listuguj Mi'gmaq Government to adopt an annual lobster conservation harvesting plan for each fishing year;

WHEREAS, on March 24, 2021, Listuguj Mi'gmaq Government Chief and Council approved the signing of the Rights Reconciliation Agreement

WHEREAS the LMG is committed to continued collaborations with Canada's Department of Fisheries and Oceans to ensure that our fall lobster fishery is conducted in manner that is safe, responsible, and respectful of our Treaty rights;

NOW THEREFORE THE LISTUGUJ MI'GMAQ GOVERNMENT MAKES THE FOLLOWING ORDER-IN-COUNCIL:

- Pursuant to the Listuguj Lobster Law, the Listuguj Mi'gmaq Government Chief and Council adopts the Conservation Harvesting Plan (Lobster – Area 21B (Listuguj Mi'gmaq Government) Season 2021-2022, hereby attached.
- The Natural Resources Directorate, on behalf of the Listuguj Mi'gmaq Government, will administer and manage the 2021-2022 Conservation Harvesting Plan, including the designation of fishers, registration of vessels, allocation of tags and fishing effort, dockside monitoring, coordination of food distribution, monitoring of commercial sales, collection of administration fees, and on-going engagement with the Department of Fisheries and Oceans as necessary.
- The Public Security Directorate, via the Ranger Department, will enforce the Conservation Harvesting Plan (Lobster – Area 21B (Listuguj Mi'gmaq Government) Season 2021-2022, as described under Schedule C of the Listuguj Lobster Law.


